# Rhino Camp

# Wild Science Travel Camp

You may register for a week of Animal Investigation Corps AND a week of Wild Science.

If you've ever wondered what it's like to work in a zoo, this camp is for you! A.I.C. focuses on Zoo operations and endangered animals. Be a junior zookeeper as you tour behind the scenes of a major animal exhibit and work with animal keepers - all while exploring the purposes, changes and benefits of zoos.

# This camp includes an OVERNIGHT stay at the Zoo.

#### Thursday:

9 a.m. leave for an overnight trip to Oxbow Park.

#### Friday:

12 p.m. parents pick up students.

Explore parks, rivers and forests in this fun outdoor adventure. As a junior wildlife biologist you'll use real scientific equipment like sweep nets, microscopes, water quality testing kits, animal surveys and radio telemetry to study wildlife in the wild. This is a traveling camp that spends the week away from the zoo to investigate nearby natural areas.

During the second week the Kongo Ranger Station will be the backdrop for learning and practicing presentations techniques. These two weeks will give the Junior ZooTeens a thorough introduction into the full ZooTeen experience.

### STAFF

All staff are screened for excellence in programing for children. Every staff member is required to have previous experience with children; many of the staff return year after year. Typically, a staff member has worked for public schools, OMSI, Outdoor School or Audubon. Most are college graduates or are currently working on a degree.

### **SUPERVISON** AND SAFETY

At no time is any child left unsupervised. The number of staff ensures thorough supervision and

monitoring. In addition, the Zoo's fulltime security staff are available to assist in any emergency situation. The Zoo grounds are completely fenced and all Zoo employees are aware of the Zoo Camp program.

#### WHERE CAMP TAKES PLACE

All camps (except Wild Science) are held at the Zoo using classrooms and all of the zoo exhibits. One camp meets across the parking lot at the World Forestry Center and spends all non-classroom hours on the Zoo grounds. Wild Science takes field trips to Metro area parks and greenspaces.

### **POLICIES**

A lottery for registration is used due to the popularity of the camp program. All registrations received by the deadline are considered equally through a random drawing. Registrations received after the

deadline are considered on a first-come, first-served basis. See registration deadline on page 5.

Behavior is managed to ensure an enjoyable and safe experience for all. Children are expected to behave appropriately. In the event a child is disruptive, time-out may be used. If disruptive behavior continues, the parent will be called to help find a solution.

> If improvement is not realized, the child may be asked to not return to camp.

### Behind the scenes.

Due to safety concerns and the availability of animal keeper staff, behind

the scenes tours are restricted to the older age camps. Many other animal and keeper contact experiences are provided throughout each camp's week.

#### Can parents stay with kids?

Our camp program is designed for children who are able to be successful in group oriented programs without parent involvement.

**Lost and found** items are turned in to Zoo security at the end of each camp week. To check on lost items after your child's camp week, call (503) 226-1561, extension 300.

**Medication** cannot be dispensed by staff; campers must be able to self-medicate and carry their medication with them.

**Special needs of your child** should be indicated on the registration form. We will do our very best to accommodate them.

**Volunteers are needed** to assist camp staff. Information will be included in your confirmation packet.

# Tips for a GOOD **Zoo Camp Experience**

should be appropriate for the weather. Each camp group spends the majority of the day out on the grounds rain or shine, so don't forget raingear or sunscreen (even on overcast days).

# REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

#### **HOW TO REGISTER:**

### Registration deadline:

Friday April 6, 5 p.m. The first round of registration for all camps is done through a lottery. All registrations received by April 6 will be considered equally. Registrations received after April 6 will be processed after the lottery on a first-come, first-served basis.

### Registration form:

Complete a SEPARATE registration form for each child. Photocopies are acceptable. Read and complete the medical information section and **sign the registration form.**YOUR SIGNATURE IS REQUIRED FOR YOUR CHILD TO ATTEND CAMP.

### Kids attending together:

If you want kids to attend camp together, **put all the registrations in one envelope.** This is the only way we can place all the children in the sessions you request.

### Registering for 2 weeks of camp:

You may register children entering grades 1-5 for a second week of camp, however, the program and activities do not change week to week. Use a separate registration form for the second week.

### A second round of registration:

Forms received after April 6 will be processed after the lottery in the order in which they were received.

- Confirmation packets will be mailed by May 1. Do not call to check on your registration before that time. If there is a problem with your registration, we will phone you.
- Waiting lists are compiled for anyone not placed in any of their choices. If an opening becomes available, we will contact you by phone. Please make sure we have a daytime phone number to reach you.

Refunds minus a 10% administrative fee, are only made if your cancellation is received before June 8, 2001. 75% refunds are given if cancellations are made at least 5 working days before the start of the camp session. No partial refunds will be given for missed camp days.
